Smoke Alarms: Gary Carpenter is requesting publicity to request donations to purchase smoke alarms for both Allegany and Garrett Counties.

Safety – Wayne Rounds – Responding in Cold Weather—Cold, snow and ice can severely hamper firefighting operations. Making sure you and your apparatus are prepared is essential. Personal Preparedness: You must be properly dressed for the weather you'll encounter. Find the right combination of station clothing and fire clothes to maintain warmth on the fireground, yet not be too hot when actively engaging in fireground operations. Apparatus Maintenance: Extra attention to apparatus maintenance during cold weather is critical. Prior to the onset of cold weather, check and test your apparatus heating system to ensure it will function properly in the winter. The apparatus can be used as a rehab/shelter area during extreme weather. Firefighters must insure an uninterrupted water supply by continually checking hydrants to make sure they're dry and not frozen. Companies must also dig out hydrants after major snow storms to make sure they're accessible. Response: If your apparatus is equipped with automatic drop-down chains for traction, check it thoroughly prior to the winter season. If not, check and repair the chains/cable chains you normally carry. The most important factor regarding response in winter weather is to arrive on the scene safely. We can't help anyone if we don't arrive! Slow down and increase stopping distances when responding, even when using tire chains. Safety on scene: Since we do most of our work with water, when the temperature drops below 32 degrees, the water itself becomes an issue. Freezing hoselines, couplings, as well as slip and fall dangers can become a problem. As firefighters, we do not have the luxury to hibernate through the worst of winter. Get personally prepared for winter, now, and make sure your apparatus is ready to go as well. Remember: Stay safe and stay warm. Take your time get to the call and back, safely!

Dear Friend,

Envision this. It's late into the evening and you and your family is fast asleep. All is quiet in the dark of night. At a distance, a small flicker remains from a lone candle left burning in your living room. Suddenly the candle catches a nearby curtain on fire.

You and your precious family remain asleep. None of you can smell the smoke as curtains, a nearby sofa, and now -- carpeting – are all suddenly engulfed in flames. None of you awaken. None of you have an inkling of the fire taking place within your very own home – *until* the smoke alarms sound off. Only then, do you and your family awaken and safely flee from your home, waiting for the fire department to respond. Only then, can you embrace each other, thankful to be alive – all due to the activation of working smoke detectors.

Though this is a fictitious story, the details are all too common. Every year, people across the country are saved from deadly fires after being alerted by their smoke alarms. In 2009-2013, three of every five home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms (38%) or no working smoking alarms (21%). From 2013 to 2017, in Allegany County alone, three people tragically lost their life in a fire. Another 22 individuals were injured.

The Allegany-Garrett Counties Volunteer Fire and Rescue Association believes **just one life lost - is one life too many**. That is why the Association is launching the **"Raise the Alarm!"** Campaign to provide smoke detectors for our community -- so that everyone can sleep safely -- so that *no life* is lost.

As Chairman of this most worthy fundraising project, I humbly ask that you consider joining our efforts by making a generous financial gift. As we enter into October, National Fire Prevention Month, it is appropriate to reach out to you! *My goal* is to raise \$10,000 over the next three months for this critical project. day of the year for home fires involving cooking equipment.



- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove. The stove will be hot and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. The steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids, toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

Have activities that

keep kids out of the kitchen

during this busy time. Games, puzzles or books can keep them busy. Kids can get involved in Thanksgiving preparations with recipes that can be done **outside** the kitchen.
