Safety –Gene Kidwell— A number of Maryland laws changed or went into effect on October 1st. Most important was the expansion of the "move over" law, which requires motorists to shift lanes or slow down when approaching any vehicle pulled off to the side of the road with blinkers on. Previously, the law only required motorists to shift lanes or slow down for emergency vehicles like police cars, ambulances, fire apparatus, and tow trucks. Violators will face fines up to \$110 and a point on their license. If the driver causes a crash, the fine increases to \$150 and three points are added to their license. It's a \$750 fine in the event of a crash that leads to a serious injury or death.
